LEGISLATIVE REFERENDUM 110

Creating the treasure state endowment runs to provide local governments coal severance tax trust fund interest for water, sewer, solid waste, and bridge projects.

FOR	AGAINST
1. Revenue - The endowment will generate revenue for local governments to use for water, sewer, solid waste, and bridge projects. 2. Local governments - Local governments will receive a steady stream of revenue to use for water, sewer, solid waste, and bridge projects. 3. Infrastructure - The endowment will help fund infrastructure projects that are essential for the state's economic development. 4. Jobs - The endowment will create jobs in the construction and infrastructure sectors. 5. Environment - The endowment will help fund environmental protection projects that are essential for the state's long-term sustainability.	1. Cost - The endowment will cost the state money to set up and maintain. 2. Uncertainty - The endowment's revenue is uncertain, as it depends on the state's coal production and the price of coal. 3. Redistribution - The endowment will redistribute wealth from the coal industry to local governments, which may not be the best use of the state's resources. 4. Market distortion - The endowment will distort the market for coal, as it will provide a subsidy to the coal industry. 5. Other uses - The endowment's revenue could be used for other purposes, such as education or healthcare.
