Constitutional Amendment No. 30

Replacing the board of education, board of regents and commissioner of higher education with a department of education and a state education commission.

Constitutional Amendment No. 31

Allowing state compensation insurance fund money to be invested in private corporate capital stock.

Constitutional Amendment No. 32

Restricting the legislature to meeting in regular session for 90 days in either even-numbered or odd-numbered years, but not both.
