- 1. Resolution No. BPC 2008-02: Establishing Hours of Use for the Gallatin County Regional Park and Establishing Penalties for Violation of Restriction
 - a. The hours of entry for the Gallatin Regional Park are hereby authorized as beginning at sunrise and ending at sunset each day of the year. Sunrise and sunset are determined as published in the Bozeman Daily Chronicle the County newspaper of general circulation.
 - b. Any use before sunrise or after sunset requires written authorization from the Gallatin County Park Warden. Unauthorized entry into the Gallatin County Regional Park may be subject to criminal and civil penalties of up to \$500 and six months in jail.
- 2. Resolution No. BPC 2010-001: Establishing Rules for the Dinosaur Playground
 - a. Dinosaur Playground Code of Conduct: This park was built for the children of Gallatin Valley by 1400 caring volunteers. Please help us keep it a safe and friendly place by teaching and following some simple rules:
 - i. Sit on swings- please no standing or kneeling
 - ii. The outside surfaces of equipment, fences, handrails, and shingled roofs are not for climbing
 - iii. The tot lot is for children 5 and under with adult supervision
 - iv. The tot lot chair swing is for children with disabilities
 - v. Dogs must stay outside the playground fence
 - vi. Keep bikes, bike helmets, and skateboards out of the playground
 - vii. Please do not push, shove or run
 - viii. Please wear shoes and avoid wearing clothing that is loose or has hood strings that can catch on equipment
 - ix. If you make a mess or create litter please clean it up
 - x. Share the equipment and be courteous to others
 - xi. Watch out for children playing near swings to avoid collisions
 - xii. Protect and honor donated artwork- please do not deface
 - xiii. If you see unsafe behavior or conditions please report it to the County Parks and Open Space Office (406-582-3178)
 - xiv. Have fun, respect the playground, and play safe
 - xv. In case of emergency dial 9-1-1
- 3. Resolution No. BPC 2010-002: Establishing Rules for the Naming of Parks and Facilities in Gallatin County
 - a. See attached Resolution
- 4. Resolution No. BPC 2009:004: Littering and Penalties for Violation
 - a. It is unlawful for any person in a Gallatin County park to:
 - Dump dirt, grass and tree clippings or dig, remove, plant or deposit soil, rock, sand, stones, trees, shrubs or plants or other wood or materials, or make any excavation by tool, equipment or other means or agency except as authorized by the County;
 - ii. Littler or fail to deposit litter in provided garbage receptacles. Where receptacles are not provided, all such rubbish or waste shall be carried away

- from the park by the person responsible for its presence, and properly disposed of elsewhere;
- iii. Break glass objects and then fail to remove broken glass and safely dispose of the broken glass in such fashion so as not to cause injury to persons or property;
- iv. Not pick up fecal matter deposited on park property by your animal
- Resolution No. BPC 2006-05: Prohibiting the Defacing of County Park Property and Establishing Penalties for Violation
 - a. It is a violation of this resolution and hereby subject to civil penalties for any person in a Gallatin County park to:
 - Mark, deface, disfigure, injure, tamper with or displace or remove any buildings, bridges, tables, benches, fireplaces, grills, railings, paving or paving material, water lines, equipment, signs, or other park property, improvements or appurtenances whatsoever, real or personal;
 - ii. Damage, cut, carve, mark, transplant or remove any plant, or injure the bark, dig in or otherwise disturb grass areas, or in any other way injure the natural beauty or usefulness of any area;
 - iii. Climb any tree or walk, climb, stand or sit upon buildings, monuments, statures, vases, planters, fountains, railings, fences or upon any other structure not designated or customarily used for such purpose;
 - iv. Start a fire except in facilities installed and provided for such purpose, or to fail to completely extinguish a fire upon leaving the park.
- 6. Resolution No. BPC 2006-02: Restricting Motorized Use in County Owned Parkland and Establishing Penalties for Violation
 - a. It is a violation of this resolution and hereby subject to civil penalties for any person in a
 Gallatin County park to:
 - i. Operate a motorbike, motorcycle or other motor vehicle on county owned parklands or trails unless posted as open to motorized use.
 - ii. The provisions of this Section shall not apply to law enforcement, emergency, or rescue vehicles in the performance of official duties.
 - iii. The Board of Park Commissioners reserve the right to designate motorized areas or issue any necessary licenses or permits and the making of any required designations pursuant to the provisions of this resolution.
- 7. Resolution No. BPC 2006-04: Prohibiting Construction of Temporary and Permanent Structures and Establishing Penalties for Violation
 - a. It is a violation of this resolution and hereby subject to civil penalties for any person in a Gallatin County park to:
 - Construct or erect any building or structure of whatever kind, whether
 permanent or temporary, or run or string any public utility into, upon or across
 park property, except on special written permit issued hereunder; and
 - ii. Attach any rope, cable, structure, device or other contrivance to any tree, fence, railing, bridge, bench, building or other structure unless otherwise posted. This prohibition does not include locking bicycles to the foregoing mentioned

structures as long as no damage is done to the structure, so long as the bicycle does not interfere with the use and enjoyment of the park by others, and so long as the bicycle is not locked to the structure for a period of time not to exceed twenty-four hours.
