

Appendix O: Inventory Details

This Appendix is being updated and will be added for the Final DRAFT of the Parks and Trails Plan.

The Forest Service manages over 2500 miles of trail throughout the Gallatin National Forest, many within Gallatin County. Trails are managed for a variety of uses, both inside and outside of Wilderness. In 2006, the Forest Service put in place a new travel management plan that determines how recreationists are allowed to use the road and trail system. Since that time, the Forest has been implementing some of the changes made in the Travel Plan. The attached trail information is intended to give the reader the sense of the type and variety of opportunities provided on the Gallatin National Forest but not intended to be the official repository of information. As the Forest moves ahead with implementation of the Travel Plan, the data in databases and maps will be updated and information in this document will become dated. For the most current or more specific information on each trail, users should refer to the current versions of the Forest Visitor Map, the Motorized Vehicle Use Map, or Special Closure Orders posted at trailheads. All undergo regular updates.
